CAMPUS MINISTRY BORDER EXPERIENCE

My editorial comments this month are going to be featuring the **Campus Ministry Border Immersion Experience, January 5-9, 2011**. Five students from New Mexico schools spent five days in El Paso learning about immigration and border issues. Comments in this article were gathered by Anne Morawski, the Campus Pastor at UNM. It is clear to me, your editor, that if you do not live on the border, you are far less able to understand the complexity of border and immigration issues, much less find solutions to the problems.

The following are comments from students who participated in the Border Immersion.

In four days in El Paso, we met dozens of people who shared pieces of themselves. We worked with and played with children and helped on various service projects. By the end of the trip it was hard to leave and I can only say that I was able to make a difference in their lives but more than that, they made a lasting impression on me.

One woman adopted a child who needed extensive medical help, including a kidney transplant. Her story was tragic but hopeful. It showed how much she had survived on the strength of her faith.

Even after living in Las Cruces, meeting the people at Cristo Rey and the community organizations they are involved helped me understand the complexity of the border issues. Everyone I encountered as part of this journey serves as an example of what it means to put faith into action.

We visited La Mujer Obrera, a coop formed by garment industry workers in El Paso who lost their jobs when companies moved the factories to Mexico. These women were amazing. They took control of their situation in practical ways and started a day care center, a restaurant, a market, a cultural education program, nutrition and health care programs, a housing project and other businesses and community programs to revitalize the neighborhood. Foremost, these women changed the way decisions were made. They found new ways to empower women.

On behalf of New Hope Lutheran Church, I would like to thank Anne Morawski and her group for taking their time to engage in this experience and sharing it with us. I pray that each of us will come away having learned something and especially to reinforce our work on the Border.

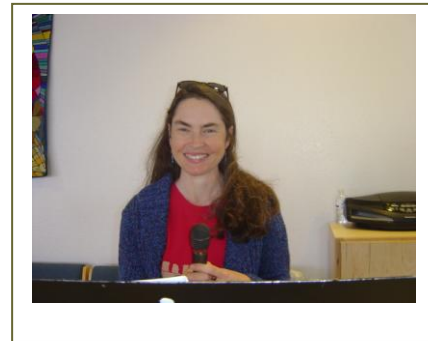
Clarence Mladek was in Providence Hospital for five days observation for suspected stroke. He is now home resting. Get well soon, Clarence!
