TERRI (Jack and Kay Reinshuttle’s daughter): needs our prayers as she undergoes more tests to determine the provisional diagnosis of Lupus.

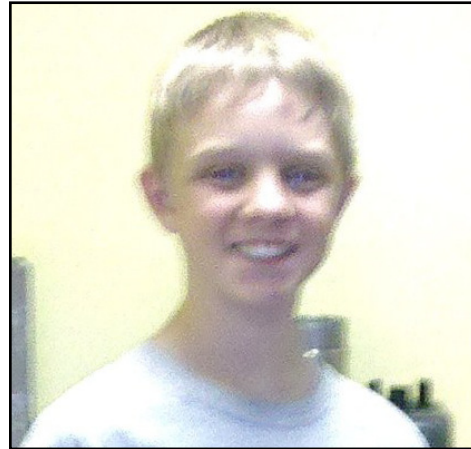
Your Church Family Focus
